Our School

St Joseph's Catholic Primary School is a two form entry school in Redhill, Surrey.

We have a variety of pupils from ethnic minority backgrounds: 53.2% which is above the national average. The percentage of children eligible for free school meals equal 4.7%. We have a stable school population and our gender balance indicates that we have more boys than girls in all classes apart from Reception and Year 4 (September 2016).

Pupil Premium Spending – Plans for the year ahead:

- Continue to support the current level Teaching and Learning Support Assistants (TLSAs) in class, which allows for individual and group intervention as well as learning support in class
- Support for staff with using target tracker in more depth, to facilitate the effective identification of needs when planning lessons and interventions
- Training for TLSAs for new interventions
- Additional 1:1 Support for PP children
- Home-School Liaison Worker funded to support engagement with families
- Valley Trust Counsellor and ELSA funded to support social and emotional well-being; set up nurture group and lunch time club to further facilitate this.
- Continue to evaluate resources available to PP children to support learning at school and at home.

Objectives 2016 - 17

1. To remove barriers to learning through engagement with the EASEL Project (Everyone a Successful and Effective Learner)
2. To ensure all YR PP pupils achieve GLD and make expected progress in all areas.
3. To ensure that PP pupils from Year 1 – 6 are making at least expected progress over the year and achieve the end of year targets for attainment that are set for them, in line with their peers.
