### **Dear Parents**

As we return to school the Church is celebrating the great feast of Easter – Jesus is risen from the dead. This celebration lasts until the solemnity of Pentecost (Sunday 5th June), the birthday of the Church. At Pentecost we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit who empowers and enables us to follow in the footsteps of Jesus.

#### MAY IS THE MONTH OF OUR LADY

During this half-term the Church dedicates the month of May to Mary, Jesus' mother. Over the course of the month, children across the school will be celebrating Our Lady and reflecting on the ways she can help and guide us through life. Children will be focusing on the Rosary and its importance to us as Catholics to enable us to pray, how the simple and repeated prayers of the Rosary allow us to really focus on what Jesus did and said. The Rosary provides us with a time and place to connect with Our Lord, and remember his Mother Mary. The different mysteries of the Rosary will be explored across the school. We will end the Month by honouring our Lady with a whole school procession- we will be asking for flowers to decorate around by her statue and bedding plants to be used in the prayer garden.

#### **ROSARY CLUB**

Mrs Barnes, our school chaplain, will once again be offering the opportunity for children in KS2 to attend a Rosary club at lunch times. The children enjoy the chance to discuss, reflect pray for members of their family and those around the world. All children are welcome.

#### YEAR GROUP SAINT NAMES

Mrs Brown and Mrs Osman worked with the Primary Leadership Team and the children discussed and voted on Saints that they wanted each Year Group to be linked with. This information was then taken back to the classes for voting. The children felt it was very important that Reception Year had St Joseph as their saint as he is our school Saint and from the beginning of their time here children should learn about him.

#### **FAITH LEADERS**



They will also be involved in the monitoring of prayer corners in classrooms and offer suggestions to make them interactive and more child focused.
