




I would like to record my thanks to the staff, senior leadership team and governing body of St Joseph's. The term is always punctuated with challenges and we are grateful to them all for their professionalism and dedication in putting the families of St Joseph's first. This time last year we were expecting OFSTED in the spring term. This spring we will be having a focus visit from the Diocese in preparation for our full Catholic School Inspection (CSI) in 2023/24. We shall report back on the findings once the visit has been completed. More recently we have a short review conducted by Surrey Alliance for Excellent on behalf of Surrey CC. This is something that all schools received as part of Surrey's quality assurance programme. The visit was extremely positive and we were commended for being a 'strong school'

Thank you to all who participated in our most recent parental survey. We had 121 responses in total. It is all important to us that our children are happy and safe in school – 71% strongly agreed and 27% agreed. We did have 8% of families who feel their child is not offered a health lunch. This is something that we are working on with Twelve15 and have revisited a few times this term. We aim to ensure a varied menu of food throughout the year. We had a range of comments many of which were positive with regard to the happy and friendly community that exists at St Joseph's. This is always good to hear. We naturally reflect on the less positive comments and aim to enhance some of the areas that were identified.
