This template can be used for multiple purposes:

- It enables schools to effectively plan their use of the Primary PE and sport premium
- It helps schools to meet the requirements (as set out in guidance) to publish information on their Primary PE and sport premium
- It will be an effective document to support Ofsted inspections enabling schools to evidence progress in Physical Education (PE) and evidence swimming attainment, which forms part of the PE National Curriculum. We would recommend schools consider the Intent, Implementation and Impact of any spend, as examined within the Education Inspection Framework.

It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need.

Schools must use the funding to make **additional and sustainable improvements** to the quality of the PE, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) they offer. This means that you should use the Primary PE and sport premium to:

- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
- Develop or add to the PESSPA activities that your school already offers.

The Primary PE and sport premium should not be used to fund capital spend projects; the school's core budget should fund these. Further detail on capital expenditure can be found in the updated [Primary PE and sport premium guidance](#).

The Primary PE and sport premium guidance, outlines 5 key priorities that funding should be used towards. It is not



necessary that spending has to meet all the key priorities, you should select the priorities that you aim to use any funding towards.

Although completing this template is not a requirement for schools, schools are required to publish details of how they spend this funding. Schools must also outline what the impact this funding has had on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment and how any spending will be sustainable in the future. **All funding must be spent by 31st July 2024.**

The Department for Education has worked closely with the Association for Physical Education (afPE) and the Youth Sport Trust (YST) to develop this template and encourages schools to use it. This template is an effective way of meeting the reporting requirements of the Primary PE and sport premium.

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Key achievements 2023-2024

Activity/Action

We have had an exciting year with lots of Sports events such as Fun Run, the Euro football competition, Multiskills PhysiFun Festival, District Sports, Cricket Competition and Sports Week leading to Sports Day. We have introduced new sports such as Judo and Roundnet and Javelin, and have participated in a record number of competitions, try-outs and festivals.

Parental engagement, support and commitment to our pupil's sporting development at St Joseph's has been fantastic and we are very grateful and fortunate to have this, which meant that we could attend/ enter some of the competitions or events that we might not have been able to do this year.

The Euro tournament in school and Sports week as a whole was really successful - the children showed great attitude and enthusiasm every day to all the activities (new & familiar) that was showcased during the week. Children dressed up for our Olympic themed Fun Run, with prizes donated by our Parents' Association – The SJA. The Euro tournament had record numbers of entries.

Children have shown great enthusiasm and hard work this year in PE lessons or trying out for specific competitions, and then further commitment with extra practices throughout the year. The children's enthusiasm and determination to be their best in PE or any of the sport events/ competitions shows through the rewards of being chosen to represent the school in any event or competition we have entered this year.

We had over 60 children represent our school this year in District Sports and again they committed themselves to extra practice which took place at St. Bede's school. All the children were brilliant on the day and really excelled in their performance under quite stressful circumstances with a gun being used to start races which they wouldn't have been used to, a big crowd watching and obviously a lot of schools competing against. We came away victorious as District Sports Winners for the second year running, and with another school record set, which is a fantastic achievement.

We have awarded a Year 6 boy and girl with a special Sports Award to acknowledge their efforts and contribution to PE/ Sport whilst here at St Joseph's. They will go down in History as the first children to receive this award at the school as winners this year. This award is to provide extra motivation to the children to try and push themselves, involving themselves in as many different sporting events as possible, showing good behaviour during PE and everyday lessons, trying their best in PE, representing the school in various sporting events throughout their whole time at St Joseph's. The winners of this award was very difficult to choose as there has been a number of children both boys and girls who have represented the school in various sports in exemplary fashion.

All pupils have shown enormous enthusiasm for sports and PE this year, not only for their own achievements, but have celebrated each other's achievements with great camaraderie, kindness & sportsmanship.
